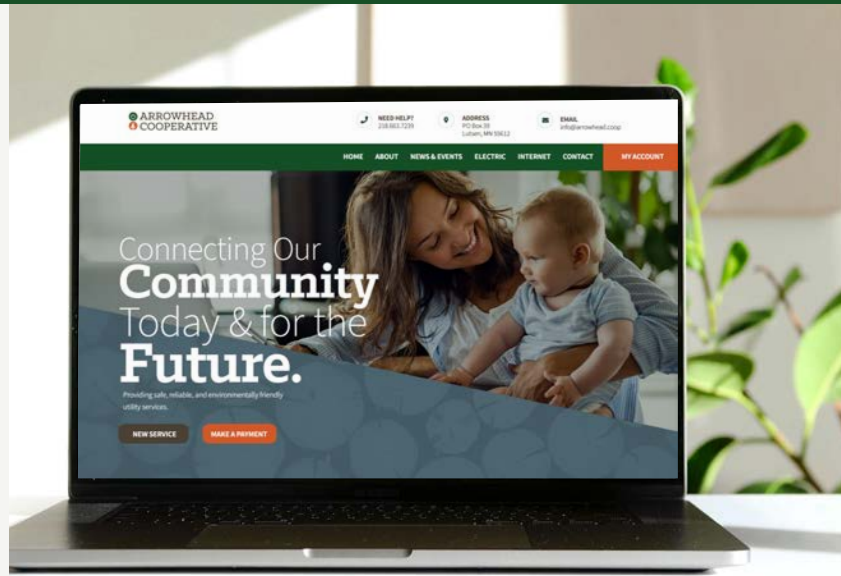


A NEW LOOK FOR ARROWHEAD COOPERATIVE

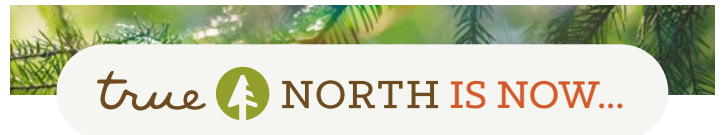

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT ENROLLMENT OPENS IN ARROWHEAD BROADBAND SERVICE AREA

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is a temporary government program authorized by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to help households struggling to pay for internet service during the pandemic.

Congress appropriated \$3.2 billion to this program as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021. The Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount per eligible household.

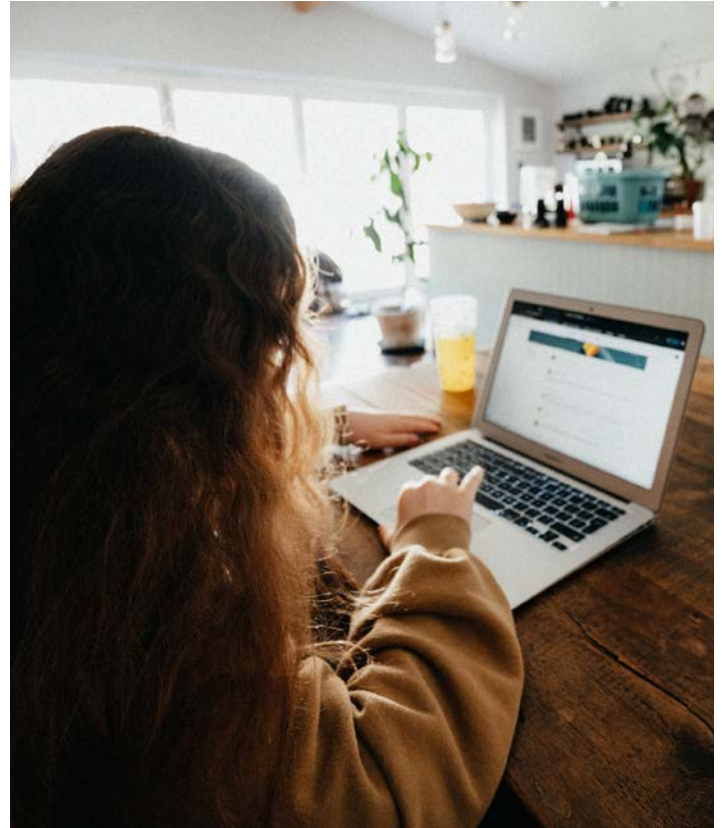
“The pandemic underscores the critical need for broadband connectivity and the reality that internet access is a critical component of our infrastructure and our livelihoods,” Sara McManus, Arrowhead Cooperative’s Member Service Manager shared.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is temporary. It will expire when funds are exhausted or six months after the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) declares the end of the COVID-19 health emergency.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM?

A household is eligible if one member of the household meets at least one of the following criteria:

- Qualifies for the FCC’s Lifeline program, including those who are on Medicaid or receive SNAP benefits,
- Receives benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program,
- Experienced substantial documented loss of income since February 29, 2020, with a total household income in 2020 below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers; or
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year.



HOW DO I SIGN UP FOR THE EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM?

As of May 12, 2021, eligible households can enroll in the program to receive a monthly discount on the cost of broadband service from an approved provider. Consumers should apply online or download a paper application at getemergencybroadband.org. After submitting an application and receiving approval, subscribers must contact Arrowhead Broadband at (800) 864-3744 to have the discount applied to their monthly bill.

WE'RE READY FOR STORM SEASON. ARE YOU?

Summertime brings many of our favorite activities like cooking out with family and friends, afternoons on the water, and simply slowing down a bit to enjoy life. But summer months also make conditions right for dangerous storms. These potential weather events can cause destruction to our electrical system, but we want you to know that Arrowhead Electric crews are ready and standing by to respond should power outages occur in our area.

When major storms knock out power, our line crews take all necessary precautions before they get to work on any downed lines. We encourage you to also practice safety and preparedness to protect your family during major storms and outages. The Federal Emergency Management Agency recommends the items below as a starting point for storm and disaster preparedness, but you can visit www.ready.gov for additional resources.

- Stock your pantry with a three-day supply of non-perishable food, such as canned goods, energy bars, peanut butter, instant coffee, water, and other essentials (i.e., diapers and toiletries).
- Ensure your First Aid kit is stocked and make sure your prescriptions are current.
- Set aside basic household items you will need, including flashlights, batteries, etc.

In the event of a prolonged power outage, turn off major appliances and other sensitive electronics. This will help avert damage from a power surge, and will also help prevent overloading the circuits during power restoration. If you plan to use a small generator, make sure it's rated to handle the amount of power you will need, and always review the manufacturer's instructions to operate it safely.

After the storm, avoid downed power lines and walking through flooded areas where power lines could be submerged. Allow ample room for utility crews to safely perform their jobs, including on your property.

We hope we don't experience severe storms this summer, but we can never predict Mother Nature's plans. At Arrowhead Cooperative we recommend that you act today because there is power in planning.
