

Arrowhead Cooperative is proud to be a driving force behind economic development in Cook County, MN, and the surrounding areas. Through our Revolving Loan Fund (RLF), we are committed to providing crucial support to businesses, fostering growth and prosperity within our community.

Recently, Skildum&Company LLC, a local construction firm with a rich history in residential building, received a loan from Arrowhead Cooperative's Revolving Loan Fund to expand their business operations into gravel mining. This move is strategically aligned with their construction projects' needs for quality aggregates, considering the decreased availability of gravel vendors in the region.

"With the RLF loan, we were able to secure the essential machinery and equipment needed for our expansion into gravel mining operations," says Chris Skildum, owner of Skildum&Company LLC. "The loan has significantly improved our material transportation capabilities and boosted our productivity on various projects."

Skildum&Company LLC utilized the loan to purchase a used Michigan front-end loader, which has proven instrumental in enhancing efficiency during material transportation. Additionally, the loan enabled them to rent a D8 dozer for clearing State DNR land in preparation for gravel mining. By subcontracting crushing, screening, and blending services, they can now produce finished products like class 5 gravel more effectively.

"The Revolving Loan Fund has created new opportunities for us within Cook County and beyond," Chris Skildum remarks. "Projects that previously faced challenges due to limited access to quality aggregates are now streamlined, and we've been able to collaborate on exciting ventures with other contractors."

The loan's positive impact is already evident in the opportunities it has created for Skildum&Company LLC within Cook County and potentially beyond. Their collaborations with Global Specialty Contractors on projects like the Grand Marais Overlook

In June 2023, the cooperative and Operation Round Up® were able to contribute \$32,000 to ten deserving area organizations. Among them was the Sawtooth Mountain Clinic's Oral Health Task Force, a dedicated group of 11 volunteers from various health care organizations.

"Sawtooth Mountain Clinic's Oral Health Task Force is deeply grateful for the Operation Round Up grant we received," shared Paul Nelson, Chair of the Sawtooth Mountain Clinic's Oral Health Task Force. "The funds allowed us to provide vital oral health services and education to nearly 800 children, 300 seniors, and 35 expectant moms in the past year."

The Task Force, founded in 2012, had a primary goal of ensuring access to essential dental care for every child in Cook County and the Grand Portage Reservation, regardless of their caregivers' ability to pay. Over the years, the scope expanded to care for young adults, expectant moms, and seniors aged 65 and over, covering various schools and daycares.



"Thanks to Operation Round Up® funds, we were able to check the oral health of every child in the community's educational programs," continued Nelson. "If any child required dental care, we promptly provided their parents with a notification letter and information about available financial assistance."

The program remarkably reduced oral health problems from 26% to 9% among children checked from 2015 to 2022, setting a great precedent for the state.

"With Operation Round Up® support, we can also leverage community backing when seeking additional grant opportunities," Nelson explained. "This funding has been essential in sustaining our mission and reaching over 2,000 community members through educational outreach, raising awareness about the importance of oral health."

We invite all our members to celebrate the significant impact of their Operation Round Up® contributions, which enabled



the Oral Health Task Force to make a real difference in the lives of community members of all ages. The Task Force remains deeply appreciative of the ongoing support they receive from our community members through Operation Round Up®. Together, we are building a stronger and healthier community.


