Through the Operation Round Up® program, Arrowhead Cooperative allows our member-owners and subscribers to give back to the community by rounding up their bills to the nearest dollar. Each month the rounded-up funds (between 1¢ and 99¢) are placed in a trust fund and administered by the Operation Round Up® Board. In June, Good Harbor Hill Players was one of ten local organizations to benefit from this grant program.

The Good Harbor Hill Players has been uniting the community through art and celebration since 1999. With a mission to honor the magic of the seasons, the natural world, and the local lore of Lake Superior, this group is renowned for their captivating seasonal pageants. For the summer solstice, they produce an outdoor spectacle featuring large- and small-scale puppets alongside live music.

"We invite community members and visitors alike to contribute their unique talents to each performance. From young artists working with seasoned veterans to families enjoying these creative expressions together, the pageants are a true community affair," shared board member Marybeth Garmoe. "Over the years, themes have reflected local history and natural events, including celebrations

of North Shore fishermen, responses to natural disasters like the Ham Lake fire, and tributes to local figures such as Joseph Mayhew, the first lighthouse keeper of Grand Marais."

In 2023, the board and lead artists of the Good Harbor Hill Players retired, taking much of the physical infrastructure with them. A group of devoted community members came together, formed a new board, and scrambled to create the pageant. "This year, we were committed to continuing the legacy, but needed to replace critical tools that we no longer had access to," continued Marybeth. "With the support of the Operation Round Up® program we were able to purchase a mix of power and hand tools such as saws, drills, hot glue guns and staplers that are essential to the creation of the large cardboard, wood and fabric puppets featured in the show as well as the recording equipment to document the show and post it to YouTube."

This years' pageant, which followed the story of a human as they were magically transported to an unexpected adventure that allowed them to become aware of and befriend the creatures of the natural world, drew over 50

UPDATE: BROADBAND EXPANSION EFFORTS









In 2010, Arrowhead Cooperative launched its broadband division with support from USDA grants and low-interest loans, plus a \$4 million grant from Cook County. This enabled us to quickly roll out fiber-to-the-home service, extending high-speed internet access to over 70 percent of Cook County's population. Now, with Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) funding in place, we're poised for even more growth. Over the next decade, we're committed to deploying approximately 20 to 25 miles of infrastructure each year.

So far this year, construction crews have finished the trenching of both power and fiber mainline on Shoe Lake Road and are completing the final cleanup of that section. Progress has also been made up the Arrowhead Trail to McFarland Lake, with the Arry Point area already finished.

Crews will continue working around the McFarland Lake area for the next couple of weeks.

Continuing our efforts, we will extend cable along Irish Creek Road from the Arrowhead Trail to Tom Lake Road. Cable and fiber installation will proceed along Brumbaugh Road, and we will focus on laying fiber and cable on Mineral Center Road in Grand Portage, spanning from Highway 61 to the Mount Maude communications tower. Our goal is to complete this work before the onset of winter freeze-up.

With each milestone reached, we're fulfilling our commitment to bridging the digital divide and ensuring that all residents in our community have access to reliable, high-speed internet services.




PHOTO GUIDELINES:

The Good Harbor Hill Players learned about the Operation Round Up® program through their extensive search for grant opportunities to support rural community arts. The program's ability to provide necessary resources to nonprofits in need has been a significant boost to their operations.

Since its inception in 2003, Arrowhead Cooperative's Operation Round Up® program has granted over \$400,000 to more than 100 local nonprofits and community service programs. In June 2024 alone, the program awarded \$27,168 to support ten area organizations, underscoring its ongoing commitment to enhancing community life.
